

Entering 9th Grade Students from AUSD Middle Schools– 2023-2024 School Year

Parents and Guardians,

Please read these guidelines completely as they contain very important information about your student's high school career.

Welcome to Alameda High School. We are excited to have your student on our campus. As you prepare for the transition into high school, it is very important that you understand the course selection process, the graduation requirements and the University of California and California State University system eligibility requirements known as A-G (see table below). Understanding this information will help you and your student make the right choices when picking your classes.

Selecting Your 9th Grader's Schedule:

All 9th grade students will take 6 classes. Five of those classes are requirements plus one elective. See listing below. Your student will be asked to rank order 8 elective choices. Your student should make their choices based on interest taking into consideration high school graduation and college admissions requirements. See boxes below. Please note that your student may be placed in an unselected support class if your student has an IEP or is part of the ELD program. AHS has five (5) career pathways for interested students who can get involved starting in 9th grade. For more information, see the AHS website (go to the Counseling section and click on the Course Selection tab).

All 9th grade students take 6 classes.

1. English 9
2. Physical Education 9
3. Biology
4. Math Course
5. Navigating Life (semester) and Ethnic Studies (semester)
6. Elective

7th Class Option: A 7th class option is available to a limited number of students. Priority will be given to students who are interested in band or orchestra and a foreign language. To be eligible for either music class, students must have prior musical experience. Please see the back page of the Course Selection Sheet for eligible instruments for each class. **0 period will start at 7:30 a.m.** The 7th class option will be based on space availability and there is no guarantee of placement.

* Students earn credits by earning grades of "D" or higher in their classes at the semester. For each class passed, five (5) credits will be issued per semester for a total of ten (10) credits per class per year. Unless otherwise noted in the course catalog descriptions, a student can only earn a maximum of ten (10) credits per course. If a student chooses to repeat a class for which they have already earned a passing grade and credits, the previously earned credits will be removed from the student's credit total and potentially create credit deficiencies toward graduation. Students should consult with their counselor prior to repeating a course.
