Students may apply for an AP fee waiver for AP exams if they meet one of the following criteria. All criteria must be verified with physical proof of evidence by Mr. Lee.

- 1. Students who are either enrolled or eligible to participate in the Federal Free or Reduced Price Lunch Program qualify for the College Board fee reduction on all AP Exams. (22-23 letter)
- 2. The table below lists annual family incomes (2021 tax return), by family size, at 185 percent of the poverty level.
- 3. they qualify as an "identified student" because they are:
 - a. in foster care or Head Start, or
 - b. homeless or migrant, or
 - c. Living in households that receive SNAP/Food Stamps, TANF cash assistance, or the Food Distribution on Indian Reservations benefits.

Alternative criteria

- **4.** The student is enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families (e.g., Federal TRIO programs such as Upward Bound).
- 5. The student's family receives public assistance.
- **6.** The student lives in a federally subsidized public housing or a foster home, or is homeless.
- 7. The student is a ward of the state or an orphan.
